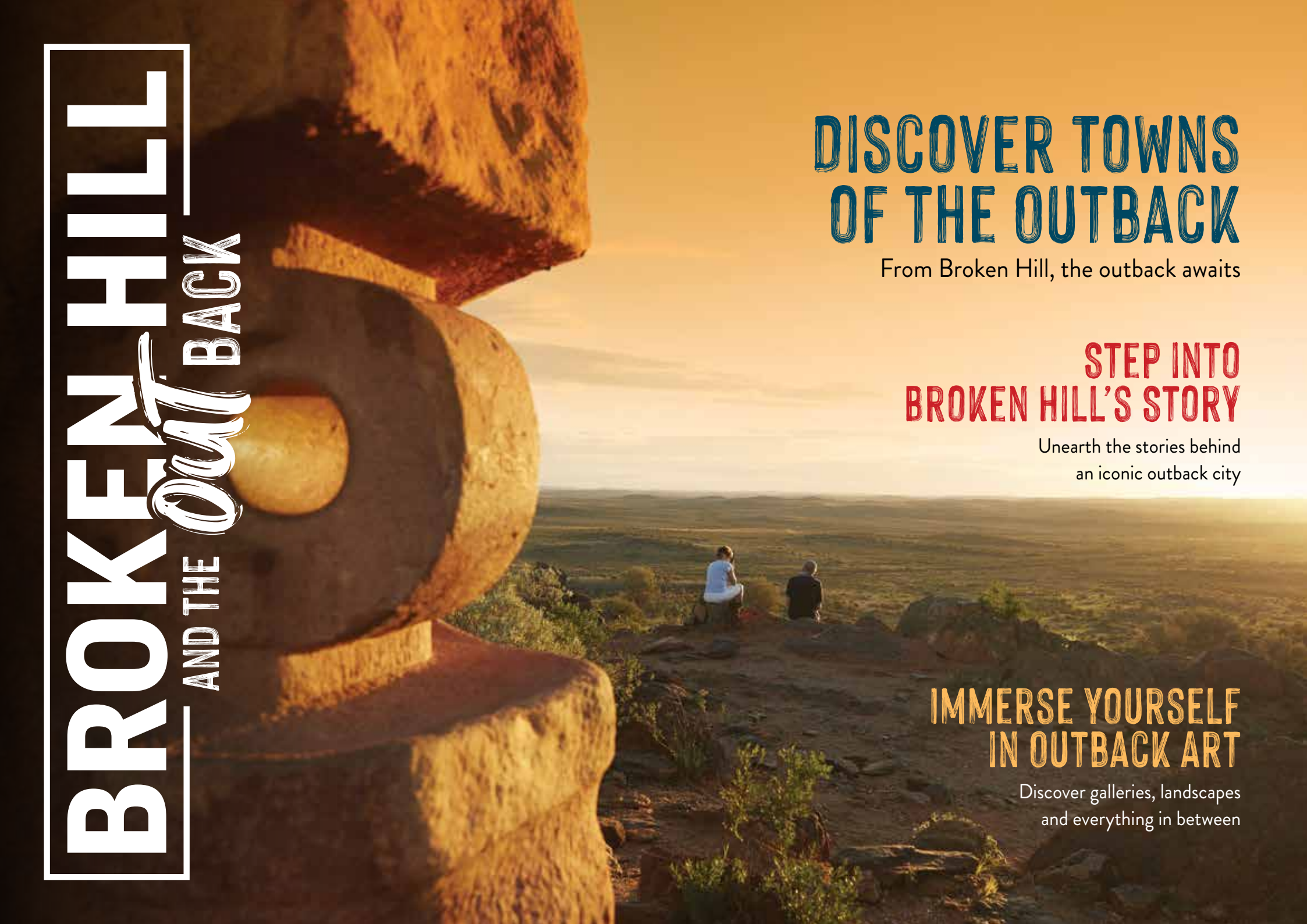

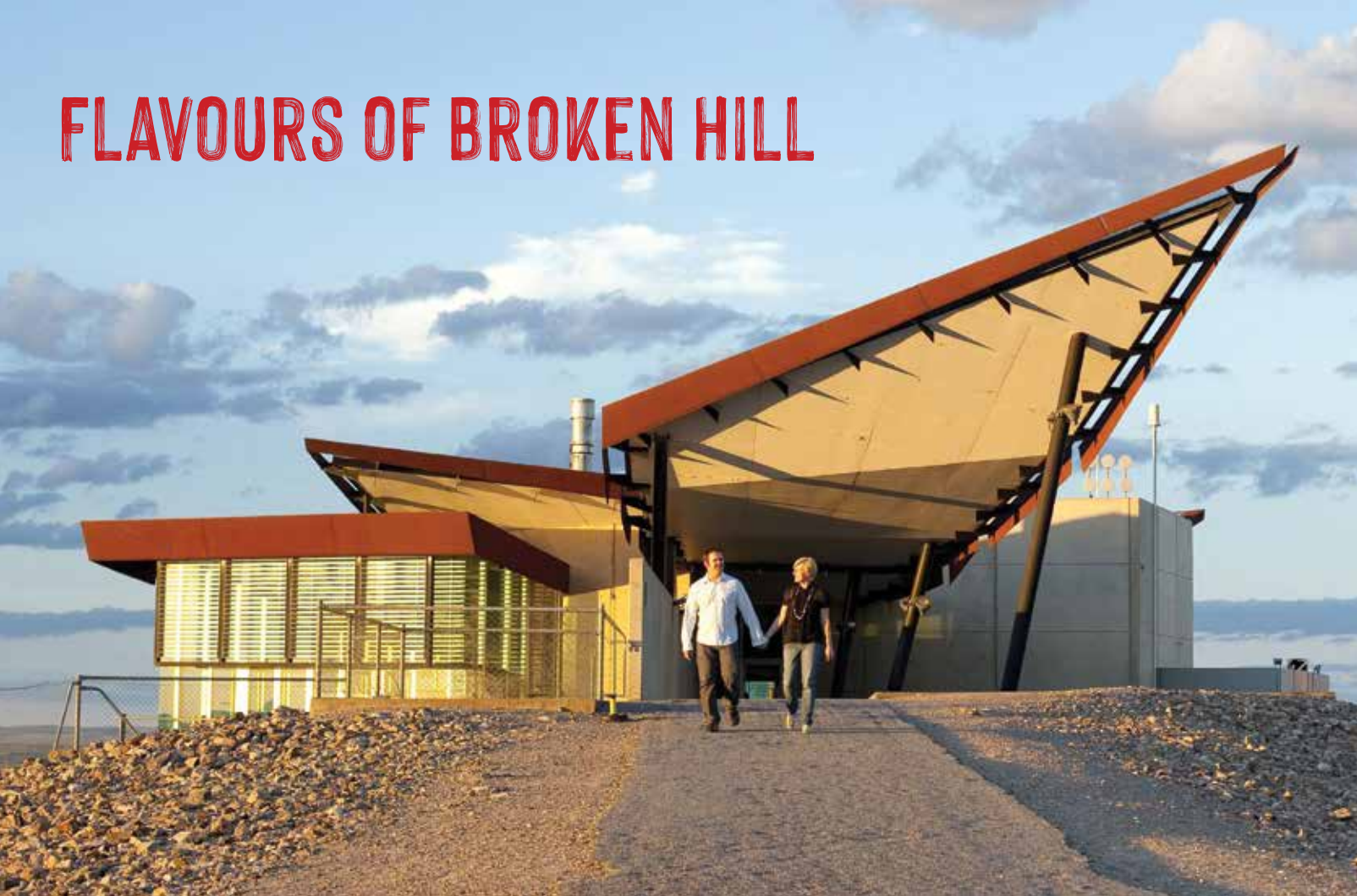
WELCOME TO BROKEN HILL & THE OUTBACK

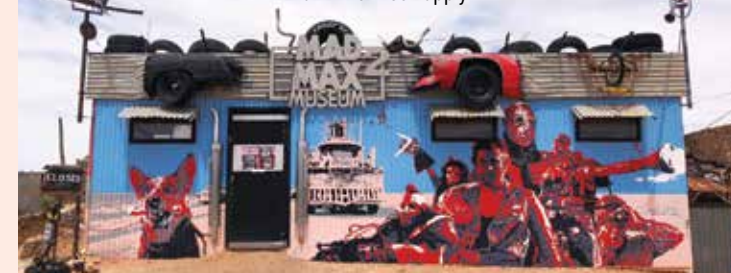

CANVAS OF THE OUTBACK

BRUSHMEN OF THE BUSH

In 1973, five Broken Hill artists came together for a charity exhibition and made history. Dubbed "The Brushmen of the Bush," Pro Hart, Eric Minchin, Jack Absalom, John Pickup and Hugh Schulz captured the outback in a way that resonated at home and abroad — going on to exhibit in London, Rome, Paris, New York and Los Angeles. Along the way they raised over \$1.6m for charities including the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Bona fide local heroes.

LIVING DESERT STATE PARK

Just minutes from the city centre, the Living Desert is Broken Hill's backyard wonder. Home to the iconic Sculptures in the Living Desert — twelve large sandstone sculptures created by artists from around the world — the park also offers walking trails, sweeping outback views and one of the best camping experiences in regional NSW — the Starview Campsite!

Standing at Mundi Mundi, it's easy to understand why this lookout is one of the most photographed spots in the outback. THE BIG PICTURE

Said to be the world's largest acrylic painting on canvas by a single artist, The Big Picture at the Silver City Mint & Art Centre is a Broken Hill icon. HERITAGE WALKING TOUR

Kick off your morning with the Broken Hill Heritage Walk Tour, a volunteer guided stroll through the town's historic CBD. The two hour tour departs Monday to Saturday from the Broken Hill Visitor Information Centre (March–November), taking in striking old façades, stories of the mining boom, and insights into why Broken Hill is Australia's first heritage-listed city. 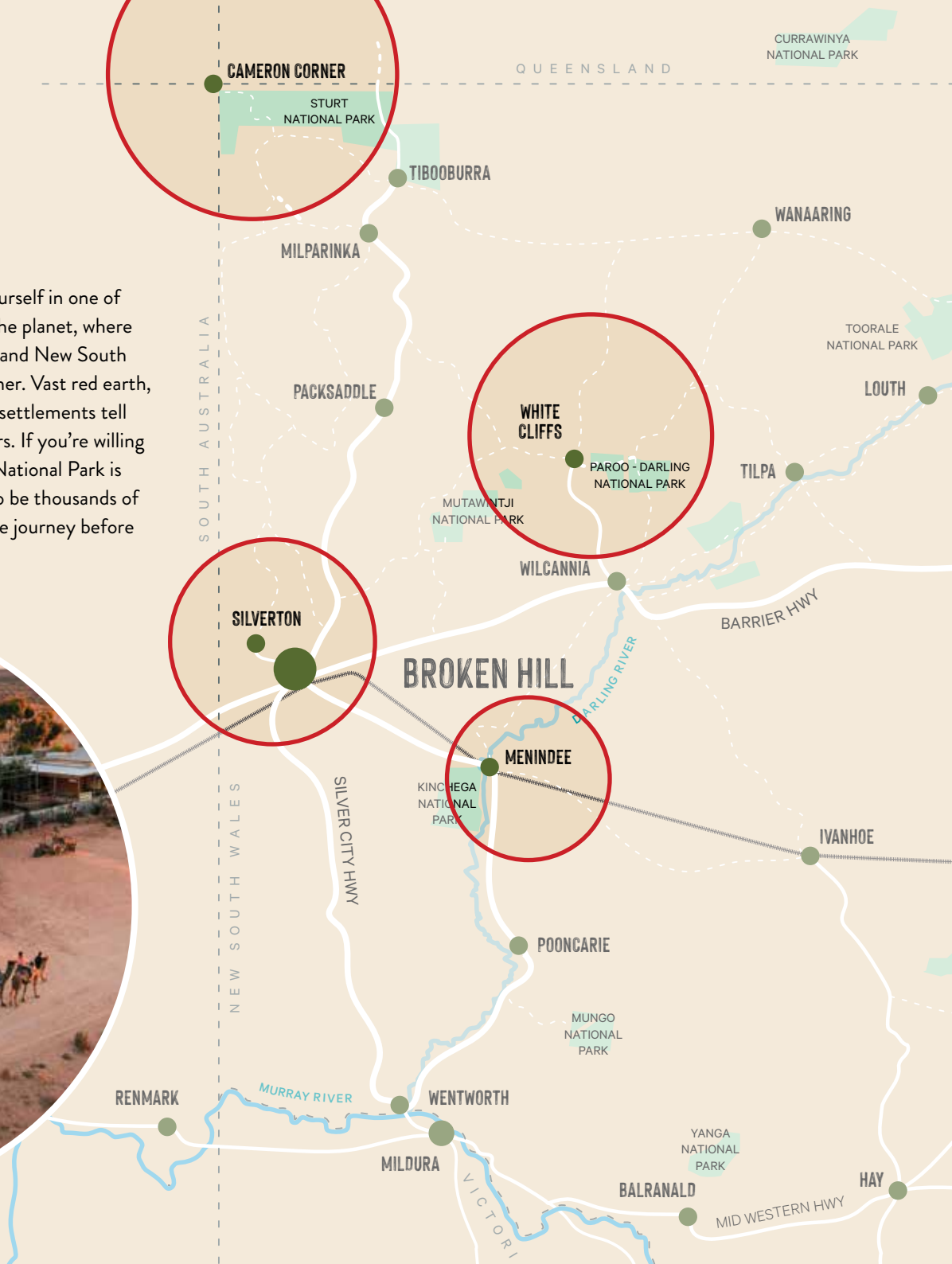
CORNER COUNTRY

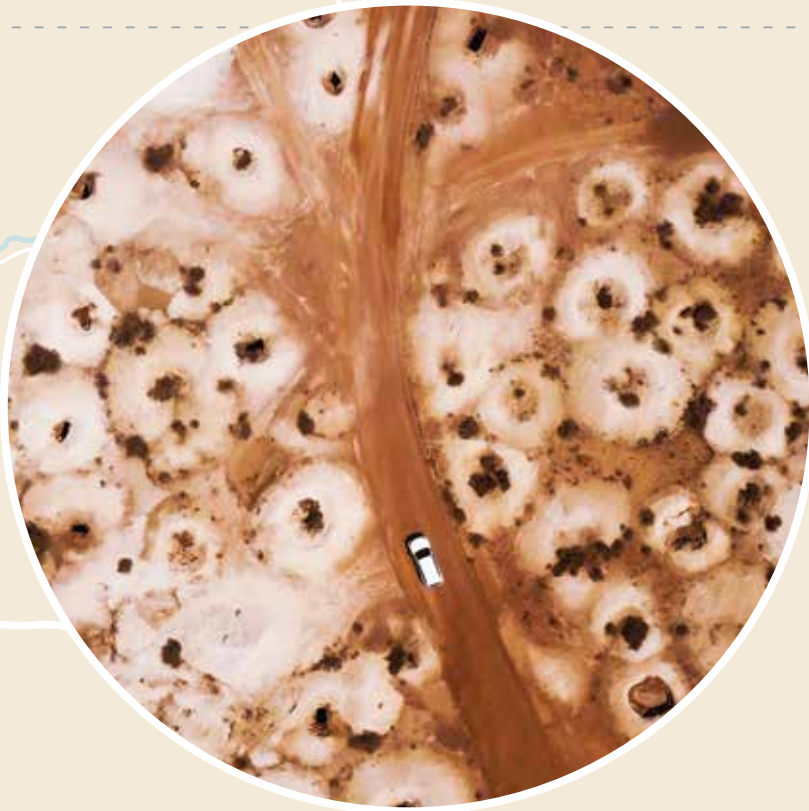
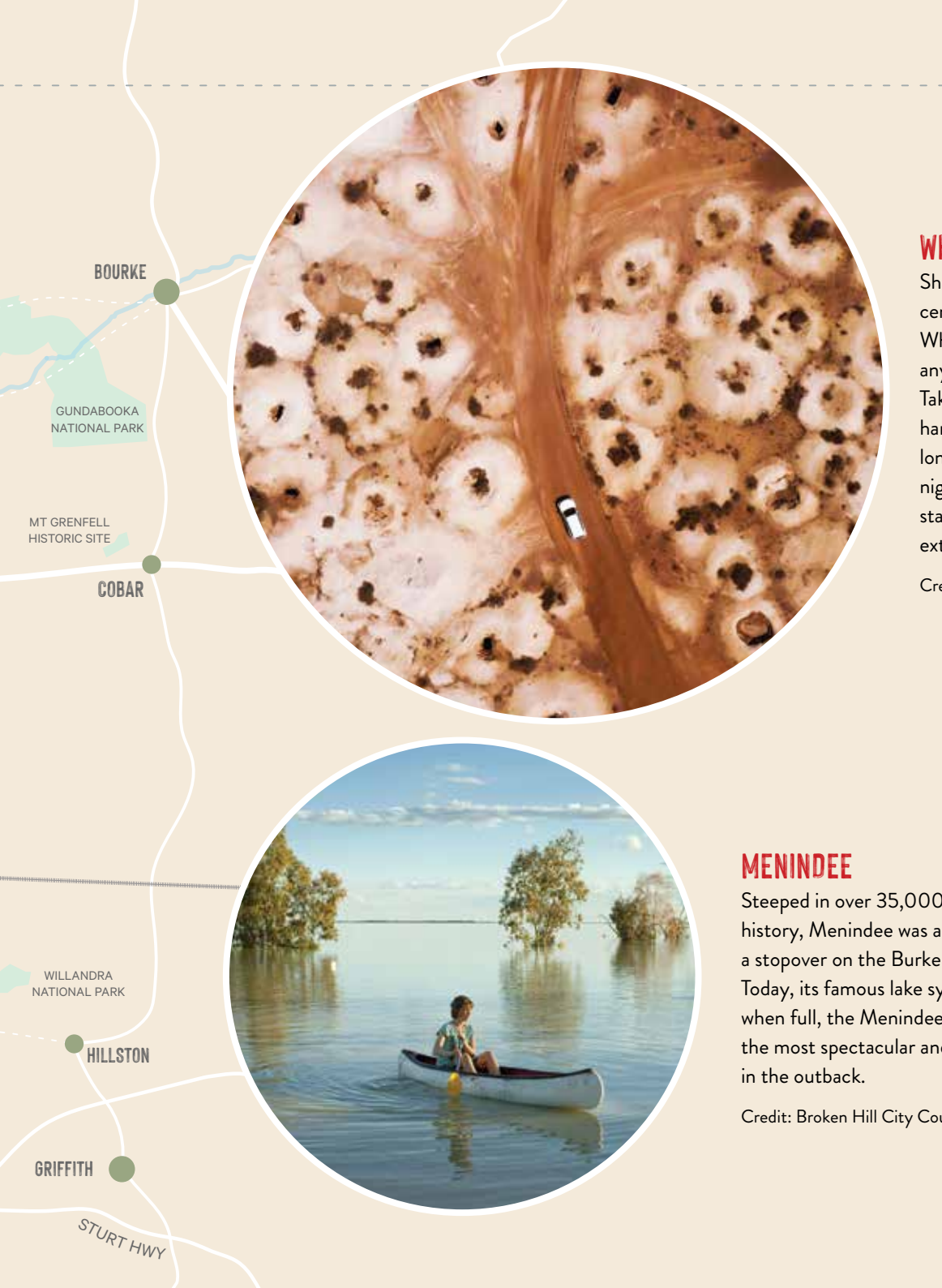
Head north and you'll find yourself in one of the most remote corners of the planet, where Queensland, South Australia and New South Wales meet at Cameron Corner. Vast red earth, open skies and small outback settlements tell the stories of famous explorers. If you're willing to take a detour, Mutawintji National Park is home to rock art estimated to be thousands of years old, and is well worth the journey before continuing north.

SILVERTON

A short drive from Broken Hill, this original mining settlement boasts some of the region's oldest colonial buildings. Today it's a haven for creatives drawn to the outback scenery, with galleries, an iconic pub and camel treks into the desert. There's nowhere quite like Australia's liveliest ghost town.

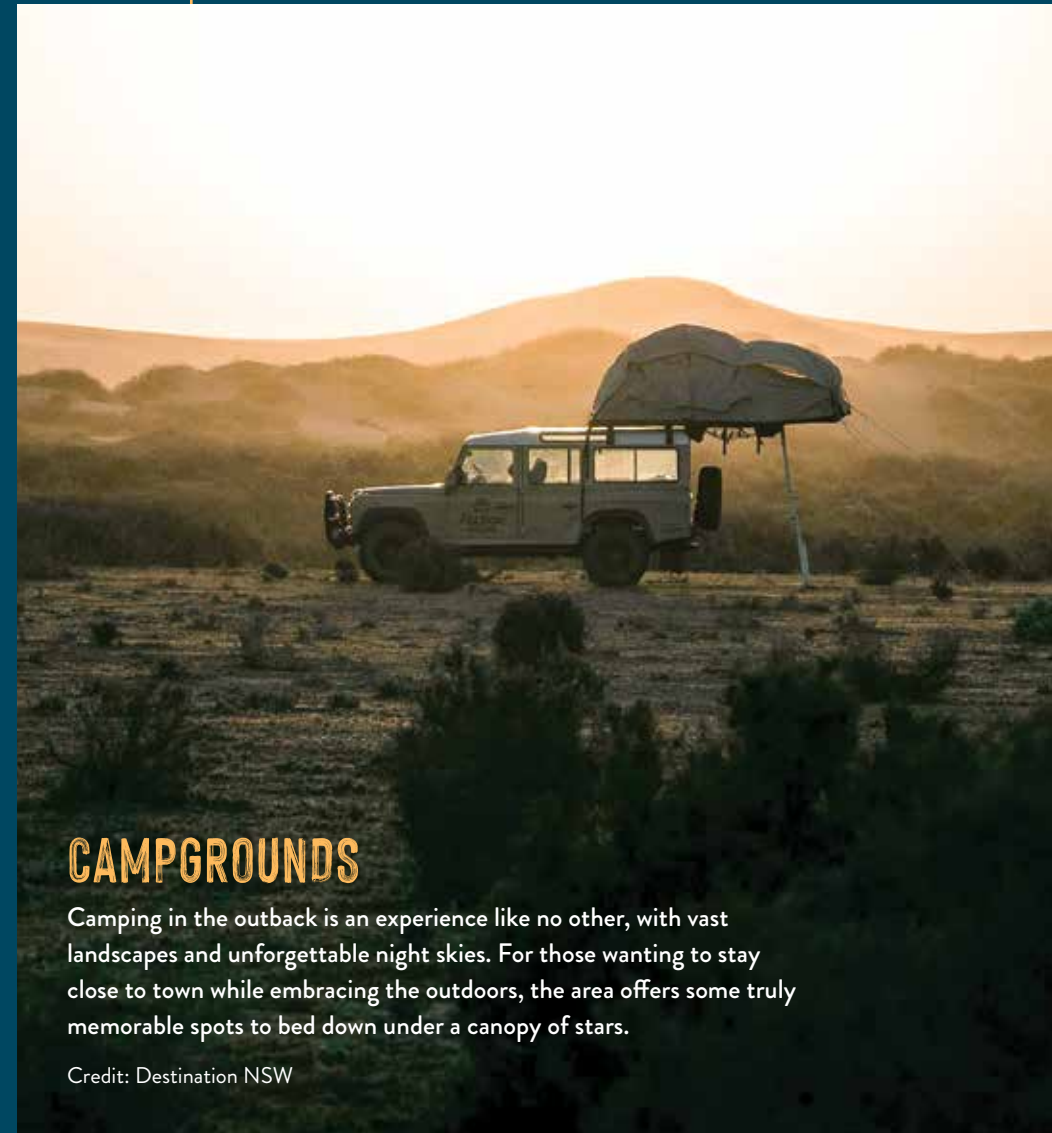

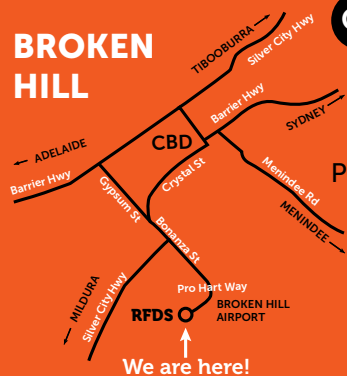

INDIGENOUS CULTURE

The Far West region of NSW is home to a diverse array of Aboriginal cultural groups. Broken Hill itself is situated on the traditional lands of the Wilyakali people, while other areas are home to several other groups, including the Malyangapa, Paakantyi (Barkindji), Pantyikali, Thangkaali and Wanyuparlki peoples.

Each of these groups have their own rich culture, including religious customs, traditions, art and stories dating back tens of thousands of years. During your travels, we ask that you respect the cultures, peoples and land.

There are a multitude of places in Broken Hill and throughout the region that you can visit today to learn more about local Aboriginal heritage, history and culture. Must-visit spots include ancient rock art and guided walks at **Mutawintji National Park**, to the spiritual significance of the **Menindee Lakes** on Barkindji country, and the extraordinary archaeological wonder of **Mungo National Park**.

MINING HISTORY

Before the galleries, pubs and wide streets, there was mining — and its influence still runs deep. It's woven through the streets, the stories and the skyline.

The story began in 1883 when boundary rider Charles Rasp stumbled upon one of the largest silver-lead-zinc ore bodies in the world — a find that would forever change this part of the outback. A silver rush quickly followed, and Broken Hill grew from a remote outpost into a booming mining town. The formation of **Broken Hill Proprietary Company (BHP)** helped drive that growth, with the company eventually becoming the largest mining company in the world.

Across town, you'll find sites dedicated to preserving this remarkable history and sharing the stories of the people who worked beneath the surface. From underground tunnels to hilltop memorials, these places offering a deeper understanding of how mining forged both the town and the nation.

That pioneering spirit hasn't stood still. The Broken Hill Solar Plant and Silverton Wind Farm now harness the region's natural resources in new ways, powering tens of thousands of homes and reflecting a town that honours its past while embracing what comes next.





LINE OF LODGE MINERS MEMORIAL

Perched high above the city, the Line of Lode Miners Memorial pays tribute to the men and women who lost their lives working in the mines. Along the walk to the memorial, mining artefacts and interpretive signage tell the story of the industry, while the names of more than 800 workers are etched into the memorial walls. It's a powerful place to pause, reflect, and take in sweeping views across Broken Hill.



HISTORIC DAY DREAM MINE

Located between Broken Hill and Silverton, the Historic Day Dream Mine offers a rare opportunity to step inside an 1880s Cornish mining settlement. Guided tours take you deep underground through tunnels and chambers once worked by candlelight, bringing to life the harsh conditions and ingenuity of early miners during the Silver Rush.



BROKEN HILL MINING MUSEUM & WHITES MINERAL ART GALLERY

Part museum, part labour of love. Step into a simulated mine built from period correct timber and walk through more than a century of Broken Hill's underground history — tools, dioramas, and over 1,500 pieces of memorabilia at every turn. The mineral paintings of local artist Kevin "Bushy" White hang throughout, capturing the soul of the city and the people who shaped it.

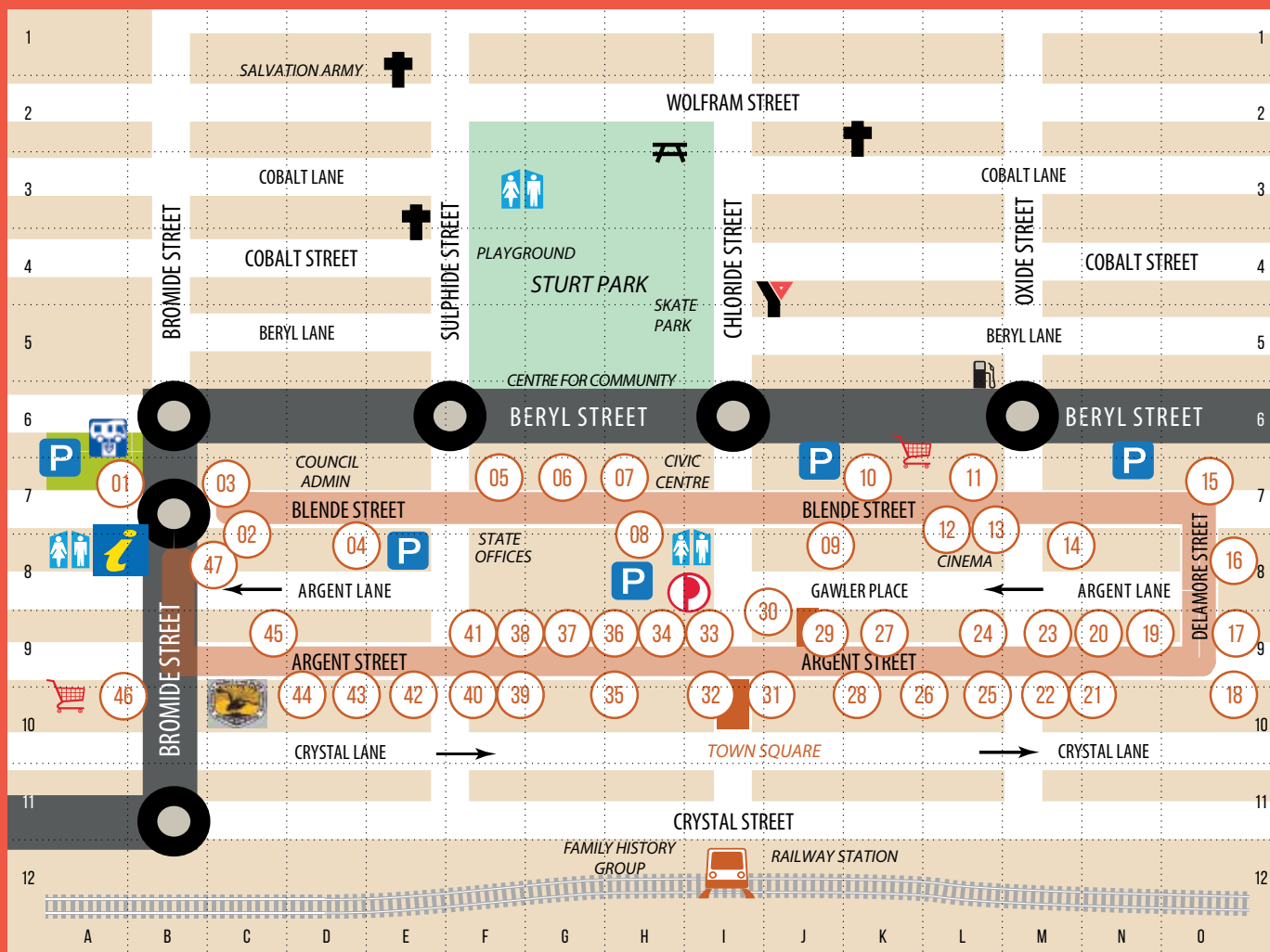
